

Rollie Bullock

Originally from Devils Lake, N.D., he picked up the game while attending UND in the 70's, played in adult and coed leagues in Fargo beginning in the early 80's and began his coaching career in 1988 when he served as an assistant coach with Dean Hashbarger for the Shanley girls program. The following year he joined Randy Baumgartner at Fargo South as a co-coach for the girls. He coached for seven seasons at Fargo South in the Spring and as an assistant coach for Concordia women beginning in 1990 in the Fall, again with Dean Hashbarger. Throughout the 1990's he coached several teams for Red River SC, contributed his time as a staff coach for state coaching clinics and player camps.

In 1995 he established and developed the Minnesota State University Moorhead (MSUM) women's soccer program. During his tenure, 33 players received All-NSIC honors, one All-American and two All-Region, one conference championship, and he was also honored as NSIC Coach of the Year in 1996 and 1998. Rollie left MSUM in 2000 and served as an assistant at Northern State (2000 and 2001) while completing his Masters degree before serving as head coach at Wayne State (NE) in 2002 and 2003. He was the NSIC Coach of the Year in 2002. He returned to MSUM in 2004, retired from his position after completion of the season in 2015.

Currently he is serving as director of operations for Dakota Fusion FC in Fargo. DFFC has semi-pro men's team competing in the NPSL and will add a women's program to compete in the WPSL beginning Spring of 2018.
